



FROM THE CEO

dennis goebel

I want to start out by thanking the Board of Directors, the leadership team, and all the staff at

Southwest Healthcare Services for all the effort put in this last year. Many of you know that back in January of 2022 we converted our nursing home into our hospital and by doing so we created a 35 bed Critical Access Hospital. This helped us reduce

our losses significantly, but we still need to focus on grants, sales tax

and fund raising to keep pace with technology and staffing demands. We also are part of a 23 hospital Rough Rider High Value Network this allows us to negotiate as if we are a larger entity while remaining independent. I have been with SWHCS for just over 3 years now and appreciate the opportunity to be part of our hospital, clinic, Assisted Living, Ambulance and the community. We do have a lot of talented staff working for us and the hope is to add more through recruitment efforts.

Southwest Healthcare Services has several areas of success this past year in different departments and as an entire organization. That included adding Senior Life Solutions, a mental health services to serve our seniors in our community.

REHAB DEPARTMENT (Jen Jahner)

- 2023 brought growth and specialties to SWHS Rehab Dept. We hired Cathy Hendrickson, PT who has special interests in Vertigo, Parkinsons and Geriatrics. Tavi Loeks, OT became a Certified Wound Therapist in addition to her certification in Lymphedema. This has opened a whole new avenue for patient care in our area. Lacey Juelfs, PTA, rejoined our team and is a welcome addition to allow the PTs to see an increase in new patients. We also secured a contract with Rural Routes Therapies to supply us with Speech and Language Therapy services. Darren Criswell, PT, has been instrumental in the implementation of the ubrZati Treadmill at Bowman County HS. Jen Jahner and Darren were again able to provide sports medicine coverage during the 2023-2024 school year to area athletes at games, tournaments and in the clinic.
- Our net revenue almost doubled from 2022 to 2023 (45% increase). Our facilities have improved with the addition of the finished courtyard in May of 2023. Many patients can be seen out there working out or relaxing in the nice space.
- Looking ahead to 2024, we hired another OT, Sarah Scott, who has a specialty in pediatrics. We are adding a Rehab Aide position to help with the influx of patients in addition to our Rehab Reception position. (Jen Jahner, Rehab Director)

RADIOLOGY DEPARTMENT (Janel Bagley)

The radiology department had a good year along with some challenges.

• Statistically we increased our exams by 300 studies in 2023, a first in several years.

We were excited to add two contracted Echo techs to

our staff giving us the ability to consistently provide echocardiograms to our community.

- On the other hand, we have experienced a staff shortage for the past year but are excited to announce Elise Fischer, a new graduate, will be joining us July 1st.
 We have several projects in the works to improve and hopefully add services for the future such as pain management.
- We continue to provide a full-service diagnostic imaging department to include MRI, CT, 3D full field digital Mammography, Dexa, Ultrasound, and general radiography

LABORATORY (Jodi Brewer)

Busy year:

- CLIA inspection in January with no deficiencies
- Installed a new chemistry analyzer; added 6 tests to the menu (quantitative HCG, salicylic acid, acetaminophen, ferritin, Free T3, phosphorus)
- Installed a new coag analyzer; added PTT's
- Added a second Abbott ID Now analyzer for Strep and Covid testing
- Our biggest win was hiring Ken in November!

CLINIC (Lisa Knopp)

- T4 Summit (Fall 2023) Tools, Trades, Torque, Tech. Introduced students to workforce skills and training for those that may not want to go to a 4-year university. Hosted in Bowman every other year. Led by Clinic, Radiology, Lab and EMS staff, students had hands on experiences with suturing, ultrasound, lab, and emergency equipment.
- School to Work program. Partnered with Bowman County High School. Four senior girls interested in the nursing profession were able to spend two hours a day through the school week working in the clinic, hospital and swingbed units during their spring semester. While earning high school credit they were able to learn a little bit about nursing and get paid while learning. These four young ladies are continuing to work for Southwest Healthcare Services this summer.
- Our providers also have had the privilege of working with Physician Assistant student, Clara, from University of North Dakota this spring and summer. She has been able to see a wide variety of healthcare in a rural area.
- Our Clinic and Outpatient Services continue to grow, and we are so excited to have the group of providers that we have currently with Dr. Adams, CMO, Dr. Cordy, Chris Peterson, PA and Patty Gilbert, FNP.

In closing, I want to thank all of you that are a part of the Southwest Healthcare family! The staff has stepped up on many occasions and I am very appreciative of all that they do for us. I also want to thank the Board of Trustees and all of the SWHS supporters for utilizing our services and supporting us in other ways such as the annual Celebrity Waiter Event and through the support of the city sales tax in Bowman. Without your support, the challenges would be even greater, so once again, thank you for your past, present, and future support!

MINUTES

2023

22nd Annual Meeting June 6th, 2023 Bowman Lutheran Church

Teran Doerr, Board Chair, opened the meeting, welcoming everyone and made a call for the opening prayer.

Pastor Ed Kvaale of the Bowman Assembly of God church delivered the opening prayer.

Teran gave her board report, opening that it is her seventh and final year as board chair. She said it was great and she got to see many exciting things during her time on the board including construction of a new facility. She said she's proud of the staff and leadership and grateful for Dennis and his leadership.

Teran introduced all the board of directors, Andrew Weiss, Jordan Anderson, Chanell Walby, Wendy Stuber, Laurie Braaten, Connie Gaebe and Christine Peterson.

Terran called for the approval of the minutes from the 2022 annual meeting. Benji Schaaf made the motion and seconded by Keith Kempenich. Motion carried.

Teran handed the microphone to CFO Amanda Loughman for the financial report.

Amanda began talking about the cyber incident we incurred in Oct./Nov. We had to rebuild the system and it had an impact on our financials. Fortunately, it did not impact our patient care. Amanda continued with the financial numbers from our 2022 year.

Amanda also went over some numbers as it related to COVID relief funds.

Teran called for a motion to approve the 2022 financials. Motion by Chuck Whitney, second by Dan Peterson. Motion carried.

Teran turned it over to CEO Dennis Goebel. Dennis spoke about studies on CAH rural health clinics. The studies were from December 2022 and the last 13 years. He also spoke about joining CIN, a network of rural health clinics in the state called the Rough Rider High Value Network (RRHVN). The purpose of the CIN is to lobby as a group for better rates, pricing structures, etc... It would allow us to act like a big hospital unit

like Sanford or CHI. The RRHVN Purpose Statement says "The Rough Rider High Value Network will advance healthy rural North Dakota people and vital North Dakota Communities. The RRHVN will do so by increasing clinical quality, improving community health, and using its patients' resources wisely. The RRHVN will share services, clinically integrate, and employ economies of scale to reduce its members' costs. The RRHVN will use it's cooperative strength to seek opportunities to be rewarded for the quality and efficiency of care provided by its members." Dennis continued to go through numbers from the studies of CAHs.

Dennis answered some questions from the audience regarding wages and contract labor fees and rates.

Dennis finished his presentation and Amber Umbreit (CNO) began her presentation from nursing.

Amber spoke extensively about annual wellness visits and regular screenings we can do right here in Bowman. Amber also talked about the new mental health services for Medicare patients, Senior Life Solutions.

Ila Kelner followed with a brief presentation from the Sunrise Foundation. Their biggest fundraiser of the year, Giving Hearts Day, raised over \$20,000 with matching donors were Dakota Community Bank and Trust, Brian Clendenon, Frontier Travel Center, Krebsbach & Kulseth Funeral Service, SWHS, Dakota Dental Center and Scranton Equity Exchange. Ila gave a special recognition to the donors and those who dropped off money at various locations and those who donated via the website. There was no old business to discuss so Teran moved on to election of new board members. Teran termed out and Tami Gilbert resigned.

Breanne Beylund and Anne Gruber agreed to serve on the board. No more nominations were given.

Dan Peterson moved for a unanimous ballot for both Breanne and Anne, Keith Kempenich seconded the motion. Motion carred. Dennis recognized Teran for her services on the board of directors.

Pastor Ed Kvaale gave the closing prayer. Meeting adjourned.


Lacey Juelfs, PTA

COMMUNITY WELLNESS

As a Critical Access Hospital (CAH), we are required to report our community benefit activities (programs and services that provide treatment and/or promote health in response to identified community needs) to the Internal Revenue Service.

Southwest Healthcare Services defines community health improvement services as activities or programs carried out or supported for the express purpose of improving community health and are subsidized by Southwest Healthcare Services. Such services do not generate inpatient or outpatient revenue, although there may be a nominal patient fee or sliding scale fee for these services.

Listed are some examples of the programs Southwest Healthcare Services has provided to the community at large.

Southwest Healthcare Services also completed the Community Health Needs Assessment in 2022. The assessment is required once every three years, and the report can be found on our website at swhealthcare.net.
