To everyone here tonight, and those watching online, thank you for attending tonight's annual meeting. Community participation is a big part of the success of Southwest Healthcare Services. Next, I'd like to thank the staff, the leadership team, and the board of directors for all their efforts that led us through a great year in 2024. A leader is only as good as the team they're supported by, so thank you!

We continue to offer our community a wide range of services. Senior Life Solutions has been with us for over a year now, and it has been a great service for the senior members of our community. Thank you to the staff of Senior Life Solutions for their efforts and care and passion for what you do for our older community.

After a 1-year hiatus, our annual fundraising event Celebrity Waiter returned in 2024. With almost 200 in attendance, and thanks to the generosity of donors and buyers, we were able to raise almost \$60,000. Thirteen of our departments were able to purchase equipment that go directly towards patient care. Thank you to everyone who donated, attended, or purchased items during this event.

Last year wasn't without trials. We went live with a new electronic medical record system in August, and it has been an arduous adjustment, as normal for any facility converting to new software. We are quickly coming up on a year with the new system, and we get more familiar with it every day. I want to thank the staff for their efforts in this transition.

A big part of looking back is that you get to look forward. In 2025 we've already added more services and more providers. We've welcomed CRNA Dan Fuxa to our facility as we opened our new pain management clinic in March. We are now able to offer interventional, non-opioid pain management services and the practice is growing every month.

Starting in April we contracted with a new company for our mobile MRI services. This new service not only offers a more robust range of testing abilities, but also offers more comfort during your scan.

In January we welcomed a new face to our medical staff. Certified Nurse Practitioner Melinda Dalley joined us in January, and she has been a great addition. With a growing practice she can see anyone of any age and has a great interest in family medicine.

We will always work to explore more opportunities to bring the community stronger healthcare by offering more, convenient services. Thank you for your continued support, and we look forward to seeing what the rest of 2025 brings us!

MINUTES

2024

Southwest Healthcare Services
23rd Annual Meeting
June 10th, 2024

Board Chairman Andrew Weiss opened the meeting. SWHS CEO Dennis Goebel gave the opening blessing.

Andrew Weiss introduced CEO Dennis Goebel and highlighted some of his leadership accomplishments like quick action during water leak and getting the staff ready for a new electronic medical record system. Weiss also praised CFO Amand Loughman and CNO Amber Umbreit for the financial and clinical stability of SWHS.

Andrew called for a motion to approve the 2023 minutes. Motioned by Pam Hestekin, seconded by Chuck Whitney. Motion approved.

Following the approval of the 2023 minutes, Andrew called Dennis up to the podium to give his annual report. Dennis started by thanking everyone's efforts for 2023. Dennis highlighted the conversion into a full, 35-bed critical access hospital that help with financial stability. Also talked about the importance of grants and the 1 percent Bowman city sales tax and fundraising. He spoke about the healthcare conglomerate Roughrider system. Dennis highlighted many successes, like Senior Life Solutions and expanded rehab services, among others.

Dennis introduced CFO Amanda Loughman who gave the financial report. In this order she talked about assets, liabilities, statement of operations, statement of changes in net assets, and statement of cash flows. The audit was completed, with the help of Amanda and Controller Allison Pretzer, by Eide Bailly in Bismarck.

Following her presentation of the financials, Amanda announced Amber Umbreit to give a nursing update. Amber focused a lot of her

presentation on value and prevention-based care, and the difficulties that can carry, like getting Medicare patients to come in for their annual wellness exam. Part of the effort is helped by joining the Roughrider High Value Network. Amber also touched on the upcoming EMR switch and asked for patience on our transition. Amber also highlighted 2023 DAISY Award winner Melani Kline and BEE Award winner Marlayna Coates. DAISY nominees included CJ Urlacher, Chrissy Blankenbaker, Megan Hlebechuk, Florence Folami, and Megan Teske.

Following her presentation Amber introduced Mariah Botha, the Sunrise Foundation Director. Mariah gave a report that included what the foundation does and some of the financial disclosures like the grants and scholarships as well as the funds they raised. They awarded about \$20,000 in scholarships. She announced the board members, Ila Kelner, Amy Smyle, Leah Benz, Becky Brooks, Van Honeyman, Caitlin Jacquot-Hafner, Dustin Swanson, and joining was Jason Anderson and Beth Criswell.

Andrew came back up to the podium and called for any old business. There was none. So, he moved on to new business that included election of board members. A request for a nomination for Matt Burke and Jim Erk to fill vacancies was made. Motioned by Chuck Whitney, and seconded, no nominations were made from the floor. Delegates voted to approve Matt Burke and Jim Erk as board members.

Dennis recognized both Andrew Weiss and Christine Peterson as exiting board members.

Holly Seifert, from the Methodist Ministry, gave the closing benediction. Andrew Weiss adjourned the meeting after two motions and a vote to adjourn.
